Since this crime can be committed by misusing tourist travel facilities, we feel a direct responsibility to protect the children concerned. In doing so, we have committed ourselves to taking active steps to prevent child sex tourism – by informing our customers, by sensitizing our employees and by working together to find solutions.

If you observe any interaction between adult visitors and children that you find strange or suspicious, tell it immediately to the hotel's management or to the front office.
